

Complexity Science Hub Vienna launches COSY Journalist in Residence program

*Are you a science journalist interested in Big Data research, Artificial Intelligence, social media analysis, or novel data-driven approaches in social sciences?
Do you investigate the chances of, or problems with, the digital transformation?
Are you looking for insights into how data-driven methods can help tackling big societal challenges such as the management of a pandemic, the green transition, or threats to our democracy? Then apply to become a **COMplex SYSTEMS Journalist in Residence (COSY JiR)** at the Complexity Science Hub Vienna!*

The CSH **COSY JiR program** offers media professionals with a passion for science and technology the opportunity to work for **up to three months** on a journalistic project of their choice at the Hub. The call is open to employed and freelance (science) journalists of all media formats.

The program aims to promote the exchange of journalists with experts in the field to disseminate an understanding of complex systems and the chances and challenges of using large datasets to understand and manage them. Yet, we explicitly support an independent journalism and do not expect reports on the CSH and its work.

In the current call for 2022, we offer two fellowships of up to three months each with a monthly stipend of € 3,000,-. We provide office space and infrastructure. A refund of travel expenses is possible.

The successful candidates are invited to briefly introduce themselves and their journalistic project to our scientists in a short talk at the beginning of their stay.

Your application should include

- a motivation letter
- a pitch of the journalistic project you want to work on during your time at the Hub (elaborate why you think the fellowship will help you with this work)
- a short CV, focusing on your experience as a (science) journalist
- three examples of your work (links to freely accessible works are fine)

Application deadline is **Feb. 28, 2022**.
